# **Boat Launching Ramps Labour Weekend 2023**

#### Te Anau Terrace main public ramp:

The upgrade has been completed and the ramp is operational this year.

Access to the ramps is off Te Anau Terrace with entry from the south end and exiting from the north. **Do not park in this area.** There is ample parking to the north on the reserve land or the Rugby Club carpark. Some trailers with bigger boats may have trouble if their trailers have struts behind and lower than their axle.

## **Te Anau Boating Club Ramps:**

These ramps are available to members only.

In the event of bad weather, these ramps may be available for boat retrieval.

### **Steamers Beach Ramp:**

- Please be considerate in where you park to allow others to easily access this ramp.
- The track to the right at the top of the ramp is very narrow between the two trees and will cause considerable embarrassment if you try to take a trailer through this gap.
- There are some very wet patches along the grass banks at Steamers Beach. Again, don't be embarrassed!
- Please keep the area to the east at the top of the ramp clear for turning.
- Waka Ama will be using this area on Saturday as well, so be considerate.

#### Manapouri:

- The Club Ramp down the Waiau River is available for Members use only.
- The main ramp at the Meridian wharf is available to the public and there are a number of parking options on View Street

#### Te Anau Downs:

- Peter Chartres has generously offered the use of his paddock for parking at the Downs. Access is 200 metres north of the ramp and is well signposted.
- Do not park along the eastern fence line at the Downs launching area.
- Do not park large trailers at the existing carpark. Use the paddock!
- This ramp is marshalled this weekend, please feel free to use them to help back your trailer or park your truck
